



Kriton Dionysiou is an advocate and an adjunct faculty member at the University of Nicosia Law School. He has also worked as a special scientist at the Department of Law of the University of Cyprus. He completed his legal studies in Nottingham in the United Kingdom and obtained a master's degree in European law from the University of Leiden in the Netherlands. He subsequently obtained a Master of Laws from the University of Law in the United Kingdom and a PhD in international law and international arbitration from the University of Manchester, where he has also taught.
